





# Legalization of Stay in Poland

Guidelines for EU & Non-EU Citizens



### **Two Main Paths**

### **EU / EEA Citizens**

Includes: EU, Switzerland, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein.

- Procedure: Registration of residence.
- **Deadline:** For stays exceeding 3 months.
- Cost: Free of charge.

### **Non-EU Citizens**

Includes: Citizens from outside the EU/EEA.

- Procedure: Temporary Residence Permit.
- **Document:** Residence Card.
- Cost: Stamp duty applies.

# **EU Citizens: Registration**

#### Requirements

- ✓ Application: Must be submitted in person at the Provincial Office responsible for your place of residence.
- ✓ Language: Application form must be completed in Polish, legibly, in capital letters.
- ✓ Documents: Valid travel document/ID. Foreign documents require sworn translations.

If you plan to stay in Poland for more than 3 months, you must register your residence

# **Non-EU: Temporary Residence**



#### **Residence Card**

A document that confirms your identity and right to stay in Poland. It allows visa-free border crossing.



#### **Submission Time**

Apply **no later than** the last day of your legal stay (e.g., visa expiry). Early submission is <a href="https://highly.recommended.">highly recommended</a>. The procedures may

take 3+ months



#### Renewal

Permits are temporary.

You must apply for a new permit before the current one expires to maintain continuity.

Submitting the application on time guarantees legal stay until the decision is made.

## **General Required Documents**

- **Application form** (in Polish).
- Passport (for inspection) + a photocopy of the completed passport pages.
- 2 current, color photographs.
- Proof of stamp duty payment and for issuing a residence card.
- Document confirming the **purpose of stay** (doctoral school certificate).
- 📝 Insurance & Financial Means.

The list of required documents for a residence permit, along with the current version of the application and attachments, is available **on the websites of the regional offices**.



### **Certificate from doctoral school**



- ✓ Your application must be accompanied by a current certificate from the doctoral school confirming your continued education in the current year and your eligibility for a doctoral scholarship.

### **Insurance & Financial Means**

### **Financial Means**

You must prove you have sufficient funds to cover:

- Cost of living in Poland.
- Return travel to your country of origin.

Proof: bank statements, scholarship certificate, certificate of employment and earnings, etc., not older than one month before the date of application submission and statement of housing costs.

#### **♥**Health Insurance

You must have insurance that covers treatment costs in Poland.

- Public Health Insurance (NFZ) and confirmation
   of payment of ZUS contributions for the last
   month
- Alternative: private insurer must cover costs of treatment and hospitalization in Poland.

# **Crucial Risks: Travel & Timing**

### **A**Traveling

If your visa expires while you are waiting for the decision:

- You **cannot travel** to other Schengen countries.
- You can leave Poland to your home country.
- You cannot re-enter Poland without a valid visa.

### **X**"Last Moment"

The absolute deadline to apply is the **last day** of your legal stay.

The process may take 3+ months, so waiting until the last few days is not recommended.
